Enclosed for filing pursuant to the current filing procedures of the Maryland Public Service Commission ("Commission"), please find the clean and red-lined versions of Page No. 6-5 to The Potomac Edison Company's ("Company") Maryland Tariff, Electric P.S.C. Md. No. 54. This revised tariff page updates the electric supply rates for the on-peak and off-peak periods for Residential Time of Use effective for service rendered on and after June 1, 2026.

The rates are consistent with those proposed in the Company's Residential Retail Tariff Filing for Bid Results Approved by the Commission filed today in maillog no. 326313. The on-peak rates reflect the Schedule R electric supply rates plus three cents and the off-peak rates reflect the Schedule R electric supply rates minus three cents as approved in Order No. 91917.

The Residential SOS electric supply rate changes reflect the results of the bidding conducted through January 12, 2026 and approved by the Commission.
