After completing an application, eligible customers can receive financial assistance and possibly energy-efficiency improvements for their homes or apartments. When determining 150% of federal poverty guidelines, households with more than eight members must add \$6,630 to the yearly income. When determining 175% of federal poverty guidelines, households with more than eight members must add \$7,735.
